#### Some final thoughts...

About 38 years ago I was facing a dilemma. I was in the middle of my A levels and I didn't know what to do next. Some of my friends had joined the Navy the year before and others were hoping to join with A levels. Growing up in Gosport, many of my friends' parents were in the Navy and there was an expectation that many of us would join up too. This was not for me and I managed to put off joining the working world by being accepted on a four year teaching degree course.

Much of my holidays during this period were spent engaged in a wide range of temporary jobs including building site labouring, van driving, block paving and testing the sea worthiness of lifeboats in Portsmouth Harbour.

A few job offers had me doubting my new found calling to teach but I saw it through and began my first teaching post at Four Marks Primary in 1990. My first class was a mixed Year 4 & 5 group of 36 children in a wooden temporary classroom which had long since passed its best before date. The roof leaked, there were holes in the floorboards and I had to quickly learn how to relight the oil fired heater in the corner of the room but I have very happy memories of this period. The children in this first class will now be in their early 40s and I wonder if any of them remember the appalling smell when a fox died under the hut or when the tank full of tadpoles froze solid one night.

After teaching in Hedge End for a few years I returned to Four Marks as the Deputy Head until I moved into the Headteacher's seat at Cheriton in 2015. Now in my ninth year here, I can honestly say it has been the most demanding and rewarding job I have ever done.

Small schools are special places and Cheriton is made particularly fabulous by the staff team who work so very hard to provide the learning opportunities that our school offers.

Behind the scenes, a fantastic group of school governors voluntarily give large amounts of their time and energy into making it possible for the school to operate smoothly and strive for the best possible education for the children.

The parents who send their children to our school understand the value of a good education and are incredibly supportive through encouraging and enabling of homework completion and taking an interest in what the children are doing in school each day.

The undoubted strength of the school is the children. I love showing visitors around the school, spending time in classrooms or on the playground; anything that allows me to spend time with our kind, polite, courageous, compassionate, creative, talented, resilient, determined (I could go on...) children. They are an amazing group of people and I shall miss spending time with them.

Forest School provides an environment for the children to develop and grow in ways which cannot always be measured by a test. For some children it is where they are making their happiest school memories, where they experience success and challenge, developing skills such as resilience and perseverance which they are then able to transfer back into the classroom, but it takes real effort from the staff to make it happen. It is a large commitment of time when it can be a challenge to deliver the whole national curriculum, staff have to be prepared to go out in all weathers to support and encourage the children whilst keeping them safe. It's not easy but it's worth it. When the children leave at the end of the day after a session in the woods, they are often tired and muddy but as parents we know that this is a sign of time well-spent. I owe a huge thank you to Nicola Cecil who has kindly allowed us to use her woodland since the first Forest School sessions with Bee.

There have been many examples in literature to help me to find the words to explain how I feel about leaving Cheriton. Shakespeare put it well with the very appropriate, "Parting in such sweet sorrow", Douglas Adams (Hitch hiker's Guide)
