As the government has adopted our *Year of Reading* idea and launched their own **National Year of Reading 2026**, a previously subscription-only website has now been made free for the year. **Authorfy** ([www.authorfy.com](http://www.authorfy.com)) is a fantastic website packed full of book recommendations for children. It includes a huge library of video clips where authors talk about their books. It really is a must-visit site for all book lovers. Continuing the book theme, a really big thank you to our friends at Alresford library who came in to every class this week, to share a love and passion for books. Keep reading everyone!

In other news, we were delighted to discover that our **Athletics Team** came **1st** in the Perins Sports Partnership event. This means we will now represent our sports partnership district in the **Hampshire Finals**.

Sadly, our **Boys' Football Team** were knocked out of the Hampshire Cup after being beaten by a very strong Springhill side. However, the boys played superbly and did not let the defeat dampen their spirits.

On Wednesday, we took a team of 13 pupils to the Perins Area **Cross Country Event**. Our team ran superbly, with 8 of our pupils getting into the top 10 of their age group. Wow! For the Year 5 and 6 pupils the event acted as a qualifier for the Hampshire Finals, so I am pleased to say that Cheriton will have 3 runners heading to the finals event. All our runners were magnificent, showing grit and determination on a very long and muddy course.

Finally, our **Girls' Football Team** head off to their first tournament next week, marking another proud sporting moment for the school. It has been many years since Cheriton has fielded a girls' football team, so we wish them the very best of luck.



## SPOTLIGHT ON.....ATTENDANCE

Being around teachers and friends in a school environment is the best way for pupils to learn and reach their potential. Time in school also keeps children safe and provides access to pastoral care.

That's why school attendance is so important. Being in school is important for your child's achievement, wellbeing and wider development. Evidence shows that students with the highest attendance throughout their time at school gain the best GCSE and A-Level results. Research also found that pupils who performed better at the end of KS2 missed fewer days of school than those who didn't perform as well.

### What are the risks of missing school?

Every moment in school counts and days missed add up quickly. For example, a child missing two days of school, each month will miss 18 days across the whole year. The higher a pupil's attendance, the more likely they are to learn and the better prepared they are for their future.

**Data from 2019 shows that 84% of KS2 pupils who had 100% attendance achieved the expected standard compared to 40% of pupils who missed 18 days a year or more.**

### What if my child needs to miss school?

Parents and carers have a legal duty to ensure your child gets full-time education. There are only a small number of circumstances where missing a school day is permitted. Your child must attend every day that the school is open, unless:

\*Your child is too ill to attend.

\*You have asked in advance and been given permission by the school for your child to be absent on a specific day due to exceptional circumstances.

\*Your child cannot go to school on a specific day because they are observing a religious event.

\*Your local authority is responsible for arranging your child's transport to school and it's not available or has not been provided yet.

These are the only circumstances where schools can permit your child to be absent.

**The school has had an excellent start to the academic year in terms of attendance, with last week recording the 55th-highest attendance out of 500 schools in Hampshire. Can we break into the top 50 by Easter?**

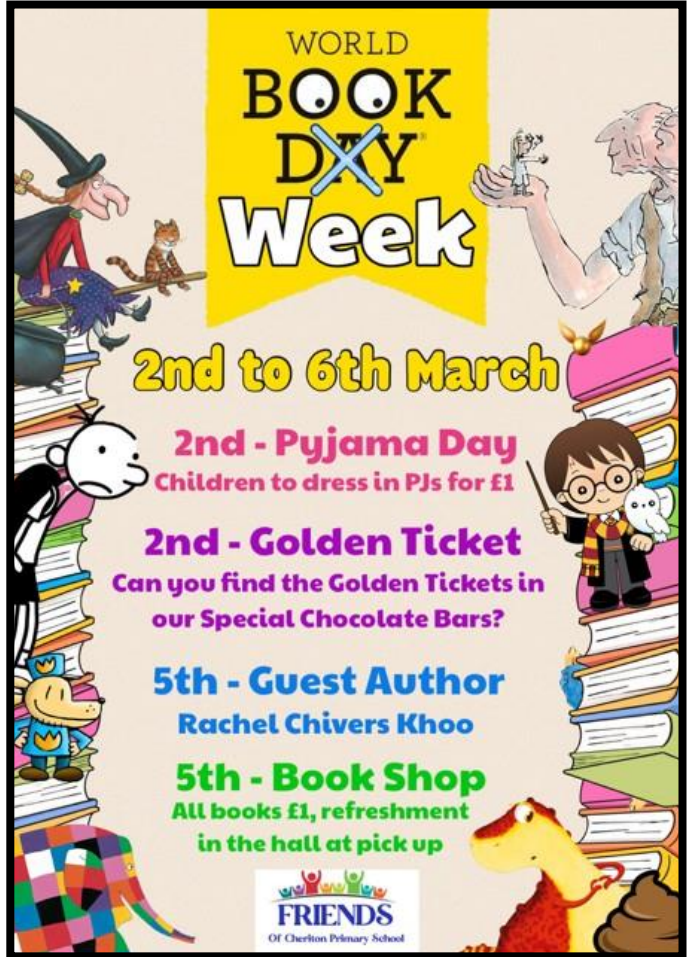

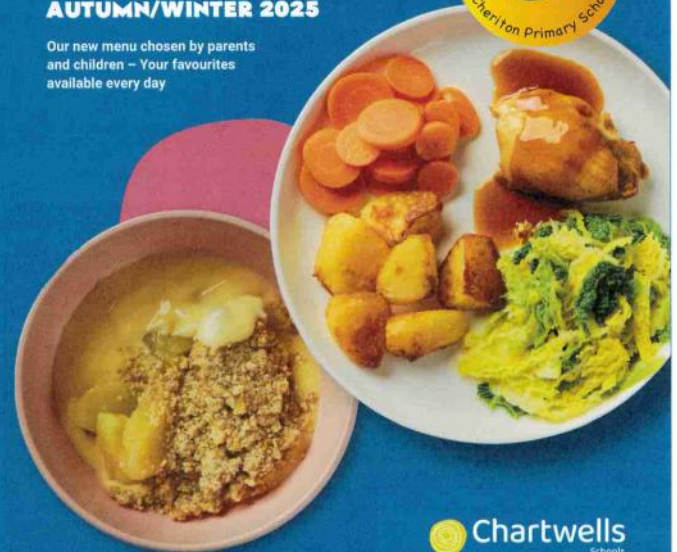
